Just after the last issue of the FYI's went out, **Sue Wendt** sent the following news.

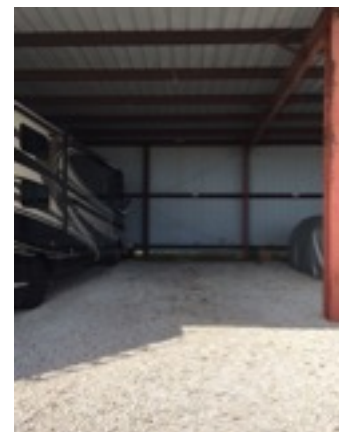
