## **Caladium Festival - an invitation from Lea Stanton**

Lake Placid is a small town (fewer than 2,000 residents) in mid-Florida known as the Caladium Capital of the World as it grows 98 % of the world's caladiums. To celebrate all things caladium, the town holds an annual festival. This year the 29th annual event is July 26 to 28, with a street festival, craft fair, food booths, classic car show, and entertainment. But the festival is about caladiums! You can view them in the town square and



make bulb purchases at the huge stand. The fair is free, but there is a charge (reservations recommended) to take the bus tour with a spokesperson who informs about the fields, 1200 acres of plants, and the 14 families who provide caladium bulbs worldwide. When **Rob and Lea Stanton** took the 2018 tour, the bus went through neighborhoods so they could see yards where the bulbs had been planted. One homeowner invited them to stop and wander her yard. Rather like going out to look at Christmas lights! A word of caution. The end of

July is often scorching hot. This year, as like last year, the **Stantons** will be camping at Highlands Hammock State Park near Sebring. Arriving Thursday gives set-up time, and makes Friday an ideal day to visit the festival. Friday is less busy as more working people and day trippers arrive on Saturday.
